| Jacobson organ: | Eats both plants and animals | Snakes, even those so small they can sit on a coin, have between 10,000 and 15,000 muscles. Compare this to humans who have between 700-800 muscles. |
| Constrictor: | Chemoreception to help snakes smell. | Fastest snake: Black mamba (10 - 12 mph, or 11 - 19 km/h) |
| Carnivore: | Use their muscles to squeeze their prey and swallow whole. | Heaviest snake: Green Anaconda 500lbs |
| Venom: | When an animal sheds its skin. | Longest snake: Reticulated Python 10 meter or 32 feet long |
| Molt: | Highly modified saliva. | Largest fang: Gaboon Viper 2 inch fangs |
